The Gerald Ronson Foundation is registered with the Charity Commissioners (No.111728) and constituted by Deed of Trust dated 29 September 2005.

The trustees who have served during the period and since the 31 March 2007 are set out in page 1. The power of appointing new or additional trustees is vested in during his lifetime and subject thereto jointly by

Any one trustee can retire at any time they see fit. The trustees meet quarterly to assess grant applications and to review and to approve individual grant applications during the period.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the charitable foundation are to benefit charitable causes for all purposes which are charitable according to English Law. The trust generally makes donations on a quarterly basis in June, September, December and March. In the interim periods, the Chairman's Action Committee deals with urgent requests for donations which are approved by the trustees at the quarterly meetings.

INVESTMENT POLICY

In accordance with the trust deed, the trustees have the power to invest in such stocks, shares, investments and property as they see fit. During the period the trustees appointed Dartmouth Capital Partners LLP as investment managers. The trustees' objective is to achieve returns above both inflation and those obtainable on bank deposits. Investment returns are to be achieved at an acceptable level of risk in order to fulfil the charity's objects. The investments should be sufficiently liquid to meet any expenditure requirement as determined by the Trustees from time to time.

GRANT MAKING POLICY

The Trustees' grant making policy is to make donations to registered charitable organisations undertaking a wide range of charitable activities. As well as assessing the merits of the applicants proposals, appraisal criteria includes the anticipated outcome of the project, financial viability, value for money and adequate provision for ongoing costs and maintenance.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PEFORMANCE

During the period the trust generated Incoming Resources of £5,871,360 which included gifts and donations of £5,830,204.

During the period the Trust made 116 grants totalling £762,543 in the following areas:

ACCOUNTING DATE

The trustees agreed to change the accounting date from 5 April to 31 March.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The net assets of the charity as at 31 March 2007 amounted to £5,438,180.

The trust is reliant on voluntary income which amounted to £5,830,204. The trust also received interest of £41,156.

The net increase in funds for the period was £5,021,470.

RESERVES POLICY

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds (free reserves), at a level which will enable the trust to generate sufficient returns to meet the annual grant making policy.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity may be exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to these risks.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

The trustees reviewed and accepted grant applications during the period under review. It is the trustees intention to continue to review grant applications in future and make donations where they see fit.

Our responsibility is to audit the accounts in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland).

We report to you our opinion as to whether the accounts give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 1993. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Trustees' Report is not consistent with the accounts, if the charity has not kept proper accounting records, or if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit,

We read other information contained in the Trustees' Report, and consider whether it is consistent with the audited accounts. We consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements or material inconsistencies with the accounts. Our responsibilities do not extend to any other information.

Basis of audit opinion

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These accounts have been drawn up under the historical cost convention. In preparing the accounts the trust follows the best practice in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charitics' (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005.

a) Incoming Resources

Donations and gifts are accounted for on a receivable basis.

b) Resources Expended

Expenditure is included on an accruals basis.

Grants payable are charged in the period when the offer is conveyed to the recipient. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the period end are noted as a commitment, but not accrued as expenditure.

Governance costs comprise the cost of organisational administration and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

c) Funds

All of the charities funds are unrestricted funds which the trustees are free to use in accordance with the charities objects.


d) Fixed Asset Investments
